

North Wales Online Reading Project – *Keeping Pupils Reading!*

Dear Parent/Guardian,

Your child's school has indicated that they are keen to help pupils continue to practise reading at home during the period of school closure caused by the coronavirus outbreak. The research team at the Collaborative Institute for Education Research, Evidence and Impact (CIERI), Bangor University, has produced a comprehensive support package to help parents use Headsprout reading programmes at home.

This letter provides a simple step-by-step guide to help parents use the free Headsprout access that your school has set up for your child. It is your choice to decide whether you want to use Headsprout at home or not. If you decide you want to help your child read at home, this project will provide information and online support materials to help you get started. There is no problem if you start to use Headsprout and then decide you can't continue.

Headsprout is an evidence-based online English language reading programme that provides engaging online episodes and eBooks designed to teach phonics, phonemic awareness, fluency, vocabulary, and comprehension skills. It is comprised of three parts:

1. **Early Reading** (80 episodes – around 15 minute per episodes) This teaches phonics, phonemic awareness, fluency, vocabulary, and beginning comprehension skills.
2. **Reading Comprehension** (50 episodes - around 20 minutes per episode) This teaches comprehension skills including the 4 key question types: 'find fact', 'clue words', 'mostly about' and 'vocabulary'.
3. **Advanced Reading Comprehension** (50 episodes – around 20 minutes per episode) This teaches pupils to apply the key reading comprehension strategies across a variety of text types and includes key vocabulary.

Your child will complete a placement test to place them at the most appropriate starting point based on their reading ability. The following ten steps explain how to access our training and support materials so you can help your child to use Headsprout at home:

STEP 1: Ensure you have all the correct documents before you get started

STEP 2: Use your child's hwb email to access the resources on the Google Classroom

STEP 3: Choose the device your child will use.

STEP 4: Getting started on the programme.

STEP 5: How to listen to and use the stories in Headsprout Early Reading.

STEP 6: How to access and use the Star Zone.

STEP 7: How to listen to and score the benchmark stories.

STEP 8: How to read messages from Headsprout and school staff.




Follow the steps on the 'At a glance guide to benchmark assessments' document</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - <i>Conduct and score every benchmark assessment (school staff will input scores online)</i> - <i>If rated 'Needs practice' try to practice and STOP progressing through the episodes</i> - <i>Try repeating most recent episodes</i> - <i>Then try the fluency building activities</i> 	




STEP 10

How can parents help?

We hope parents will be able to:

- Help their child complete 3 sessions per week
- Sit with their child when completing the episodes
- Listen to their child read after every episode

It would be very helpful if parents could also:

- Listen and score each Benchmark Assessment (after every 10th episode)
- Conduct Fluency Building if/when required
- Communicate with school staff through messages on Headsprout or through email e.g. episode percentage scores, benchmark scores and/or whether a child needs to repeat an episode or conduct the fluency building

We hope this guide helps you deliver Headsprout at home so that we can all help *Keep Pupils Reading!*
