PTFA UPDATE



It's been a very busy 3 months for Ysgol Esgob Morgan's PTFA volunteers so we thought it would be prime time to let all our parents and carers know what we've been up to.

We kicked off in January with a clothes donation that saw 102kg of unwanted clothes being donated, most of which was given to Bag2School and the PTFA received £50 back. On top of this, any unwanted pieces of school uniform that was donated was kept by the school for spares.

In February we had International Pancake day where all children who wanted a pancake were served home-made American pancakes with a topping of choice!

At the end of February, we held our first book fair which was a huge success and set a new record for the school. £403 worth of books were given to the school on the back of parents and carers purchasing books for their children.

At the start of March, we held our very first Paint and Prosecco night which was a sell out, so much so, we have another planned for May!

The middle of March saw International Pi-day, all children were treated to a jam tart whilst the teachers introduced the concept of Pi.

Only a week later we held Easter Egg bingo, which again was a sell out event and made £700!!

Unfortunately, we have had to postpone the Summer Fete as we didn't get enough volunteers to support such a big event, however, we have lots of smaller exciting events coming up and we're having lots of discussions on how the money the PTFA makes can benefit your child, so watch this space!

You may have noticed a survey link that came out for some feedback, this has now closed but we will be providing some updates on how we have progressed with your feedback soon.

Thank you to all parents, carers, teachers and volunteers who support the PTFA and our events. All profits from events such as the bingo and paint nights go straight back into the school to provide extra curricular activities that are not covered by any funding the school receives - an example of this was the Pi-day.
