- We follow the Young Money Primary Planning Framework - Financial Education Primary Planning Framework. All year groups work through a sequence of lessons that ensures progression of Financial And Enterprise Education knowledge, skills and attitudes through four key themes:
 - *How to manage money;
 - *Becoming a critical consumer;
 - *Managing risks and emotions associated with money;
 - *Understanding the important role money plays in our lives.
- We participate in 'My Money Week' annually
- We run pupil led businesses at our school, such as, 'Quirky Crafts' and 'Fruit Tuck'
- We provide a wide range of learning experiences about the 'World of Work' hosting careers days

Our financial and enterprise education provision helps to create a culture where our children can understand and respect the value of money whilst making sensible financial choices.

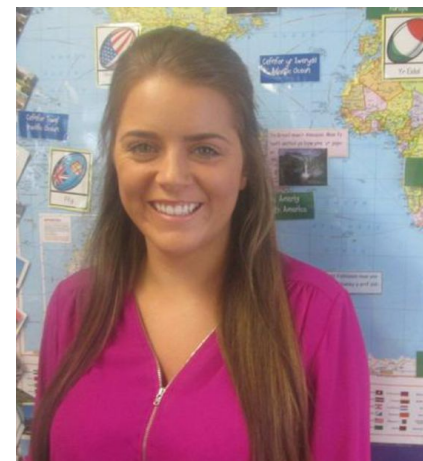
